

ART.01

Competition Announcement

The Camerata Strumentale Città di Prato and the Florence Philharmonic Orchestra - la Filharmonie are announcing the second edition of the international competition for symphonic composition Dante 700 – "La dolce sinfonia di paradiso". The project aims to promote creative energies in the field of orchestral composition, focusing on the figure and poetry of Dante Alighieri. The submitted scores shall draw inspiration from the Canto XI of Paradise (Divine Comedy, Canticle III) with particular focus on the figure of Saint Francis of Assisi and specific reference to verses 28-120 (Appendix 01) addressing the themes of Peace and Poverty. A source of inspiration shall also be Saint Francis' own Canticle of the Creatures (Appendix 02), arguably the first literary text written in the early Italian language by an identified author; in the Canticle, the sentiment of brotherhood uniting humankind with all other Creatures encourages respect and protection of the Environment.

ART.02

Composition

The competition requires the composition of a symphonic piece, of maximum 15 minutes duration. The instrumentation must include the following instruments, which can be used in full or partially:

- 2 flutes (2° also piccolo)
- 2 oboes (2° also English horn)
- 2 clarinets (2° also bass clarinet)
- 2 bassoons
- 2 horns
- 2 trumpets
- Timpani (1 musician)
- Percussions (2 musicians)
- Harp
- Celeste/Piano (1 musician)
- Strings (10,8,6,5,3)

It is permitted to include a mid-range voice either female or male.

Electronics:

- It is permitted to include 1 player for a possible electronic part consisting of
 - 1. A playlist of pre-recorded materials saved on a storage device
 - 2. Sampler and/or synthesizer performed via MIDI keyboard
- It is permitted to include **live electronics** with an additional performer as sound director; such part of live electronics may consist of the sound processing of individual or groups of instruments, or of the entire orchestra as well as the voice, with a small set of microphones. The PA (public address) system will be stereophonic only.
- It is required to specify the interaction between the electronic part and the conductor, including synchronization systems based on in-ear-monitors or other devices.

 Software used or patches designed by the composer shall be integrated when designing the performance with the staff of Centro Tempo Reale (Center for Music Production, Research and Education). To this end the composer is expected to spend a short period in Florence, prior to the performance, working in the Tempo Reale studios.

Furthermore, under penalty of exclusion from the competition, the submitted score must be **original and unpublished**. It must never have been presented in other competitions, performed in public concerts, distributed via the web, broadcast by radio and/or television, nor recorded for commercial use.

ART.03

The competition is open to composers of any nationality, with no age limit

Jury

The Jury will be chaired by Maestro Anders Hillborg and include Maestri Silvia Colasanti, Mauro Montalbetti, Andrea Rebaudengo, Reza Vali, Alberto Batisti and Paolo Cognetti. Maestro Nima Keshavarzi, the conductor for the final concert, will support the Jury's work.

Secretary of the Competition is Dr. Elisa Furiosi. The Jury's decision is final and not subject to appeal.

ART.05

Awards

The Jury will award the following three prizes:

- First prize of 5.000,00 (fivethousand/00)€, gross of taxes
- **Second prize** of 3.000,00 (threethousand/00)€, gross of taxes
- Third prize of 2.000,00 (twothousand/00)€, gross of taxes

The winning composition (first prize) will be published in the series Stilnovo, promoted by **Edizioni Musicali Curci** in Milan and by **CIDIM** (Italian National Music Committee).

The Jury might select another score for a "Special Mention" in addition to the three finalist compositions.

The three finalist scores – along with the possible piece selected as "Special mention" – will be **performed** in a public concert and **recorded** by Camerata Strumentale Città di Prato and La Filharmonie, and **broadcast by Rete Toscana Classica and RAI5**. The audio-video recording of the final concert will be distributed by the CIDIM to the international web of Italian cultural institutes of MAECI.

The composers of the three finalist scores are invited to attend and collaborate in the rehearsals prior to the awards concert.

The travel and accommodation expenses of the three finalist composers on rehearsal days and on the day of the performance will be covered by the Organization.

ART.06

ART.07

How to participate

The application to the competition must be **submitted exclusively online** on the page <u>www.lafilharmonie.com/dante700/</u> within the terms indicated in art. 08.

The submitted score must be anonymous, perfectly legible, marked with a recognisable motto and with no signs or marks that could lead in any way to the identification of the participant.

The application form must contain the following **information**:

- Name and surname
- Date and place of birth
- Nationality
- Residential address, together with telephone number and email address
- Acceptance of the present Regulations by the participant
- Statement declaring that the composition is original and that it has never been published, performed, or recorded
- Statement declaring to be the owner of the Score and, in the case
 of third-party copyrights including those of any co-authors ensuring that all necessary authorizations for the use of the work
 have been obtained, thereby releasing the Competition from any
 liability for any violations of such rights.
- Authorization for the work's performance, recording, radiotelevision and online broadcasting of the final concert, and for the use of photographs and relevant documentation
- Authorization for the publication of the composition.
- Guarantee to possess the requirements and ownership of all copyrights to make the above-mentioned statements.

And attach:

- Receipt of the payment for the application fee of art. 06 in JPG or PDF format.
- Complete score in PDF format, drawn up with a professional software (e.g. Finale, Sibelius, Dorico).
- An audio file in MP3 format of the playlist of pre-recoded materials and/or of the sampler/synthesizer parts (if present)
- Curriculum Vitae in English
- Copy of a valid identity document or passport in JPG or PDF format
- Recent photograph in JPG or PDF format
- It is recommended, although not mandatory, that participants send a Midi simulation in MP3 format of the submitted score without signs of identification of the composer.
- Optionally, participants can attach a short description of the work, in PDF format, written in English.

ART.08

Deadlines and Calendar

All material listed in art. 07 must be sent via email and received no later than **17th July 2023, midnight GMT+1**.

The selection of the three finalist compositions will be declared by **10th September 2023** and will be announced through the websites of Camerata Strumentale Città di Pratoand and la Filharmonie (www.cameratastrumentale.org) (www.lafilharmonie.com).

Composers of the finalist scores are expected to provide for the realization and sending, exclusively by e-mail, of **all the orchestra material**, all parts of the individual instruments in PDF format, drawn up with a professional software (e.g. Finale, Sibelius, Dorico), and whatever is necessary for the performance no later than **15th September 2023, midnight GMT+1**. If, for any reason, any finalist fails to comply with this deadline (or the material is incomplete or graphically incompatible with standard professional use) they will lose all rights to the performance of their piece and will be excluded from the competition.

The public performance of the three selected scores, in addition to the piece selected as "Special Mention," if any, and the announcement of the winner will take place in the **Teatro Politeama Pratese** on **6th October 2023**.

ART.09

Responsability

The Organisation disclaims any liability in case of failure or incorrect reception of registration documents, caused by their transmission via any means and for any reason. Within the limits of its ability, the Organisation will try to inform each candidate should the documentation be incomplete or illegible, and allow them to resend the materials. The Organisation disclaims any liability in the event of a breach of copyright by competitors.

ART.11

General conditions and privacy policy

Nothing will be due by the Competition Organisation for the complete orchestral parts and their use on occasions related to the event. The composer of the winning score agrees to the work's recording (television, radio, and audio) and to its posting on websites, without any extra cost for the Organization.

Being understood that the author will hold the copyright, the Camerata Strumentale di Prato and La Filharmonie will keep the score and parts in their archives and retain the ownership, which would allow them to use the material also in further concerts that they might sponsor, upon agreement on rental costs, and in respect of performing rights due to the composer.

In accordance with article 13 of the GDPR 2016/679 (E.U. General Data Protection Regulation) and article 13 of the Italian D.Lgs 196/2003 we inform all participants that personal data provided by them will be used solely for the purposes of the competition.

ART. 12

Final regulations

Participation in the competition implies unconditional acceptance by the participant of all the rules established by the competition announcement.

The Camerata Strumentale Città di Prato and the Florence Philarmonic Orchestra La Filharmonie reserve the right to modify due dates and regulations at any time; both organisations remain committed to share immediate updates on their respective websites www.cameratastrumentale.org and www.lafilharmonie.com.

In the event of claims or dispute, the only legal valid document is this Notice of Competition in its Italian text. The Court of Prato will have exclusive competence.
